


we are incomplete apart from our God, and it is in our desire to be guided in every moment that we find the peace and courage of Christ in our lives.

- Respond to individual family requests for assistance as needed. For example, FSC paid the EMT test fee for a mom who had a scholarship for the EMT training course but not for the test. FSC also purchased baby formula and provided a gift certificate to Stop and Shop when a mom's WIC checks, cash and food stamps were stolen.



What Do You Know About The Jesse Tree?


Jesse Trees are a very old Christmas tradition and first started in medieval times. They are used to help tell the story of the Bible from creation to the Christmas Story.

The name comes from Jesse who was the Father of the great King David. One prophecy in the bible, in the book of Isaiah, says:

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him-- the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD-- and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. Isaiah 11:1-3(NIV)

A branch is a sign of new life and new beginnings. Jesus was a decedent of King David and as Christians we believe that Jesus is this new branch.

The first Jesse trees were large carvings, tapestries or even stained glass windows put in Churches that helped illiterate people to learn about the bible from creation to the Christmas Story. But now Jesse Trees are used as a kind of Advent Calendar. Each day through Advent (or sometimes just on the four Sundays of Advent) a special decoration or ornament that tells a story from the Bible, is hung on the tree. There are many different stories and symbols you can use. Here are just a few of the possible symbols and related stories: a rainbow for the story of Noah and the flood; a burning bush for the story of Moses; a sheaf of wheat for the story of Ruth; a ram for the story of Abraham and Isaac; an apple and snake for the story of Adam and Eve; a manger for the story of Jesus birth; a whale for the story of Jonah; and the list goes on.
