

The Season of Lent, a period of forty days (excluding Sundays) leading up to Easter, begins on February 18 with Ash Wednesday, and concluding on April 5 with Easter Sunday Celebration. Lent is a spiritual season of the Christian year when we take additional time to think and pray through our Christian Faith, and consider what additions and subtractions need to be made in our life. The purpose is to more closely align ourselves with the Holiness of God, and prepare to embrace opportunities to come. In short, the Lenten season is a time for starting fresh, and preparing to take new steps to deepen our spiritual formation.

Traditionally, Lent is associated with fasting. Sometimes fasting is associated with removing certain food choices from our diet. Also, fasting is associated with removing distractions and clutter in our mind and lives, and creating new time for healthy spiritual practices like meditation, additional church services, and time away from electronics and media.

Practically speaking, I offer these suggestions in preparation for the Lenten season:

- Set aside time for scripture. For example, read one chapter of Proverbs every day during Lent. Or, pick a Gospel and commit to read the whole Gospel between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday.
- Set limits on the amount of internet browsing and television during Lent.
- Choose a small portion of scripture that is meaningful to you and recite it out loud every day.
- Choose a person or circumstance you are struggling with or worried about and pray about it every day.
- Give to a new ministry in your community or church activity with time and money.
- Forgive someone.
- Ask someone to join you in prayer. Prayer partners and groups are effective ways to refocus our lives as well as confront challenges and struggles.
- Most of all, remember that each and every one of us is deeply loved by God, including our best and worst of days, and every day we are accepted into the mercy and good grace of our Lord.



We will celebrate the beginning of the Lenten Season with a Worship Service on February 18 at 7 pm. The service will be our traditional hymn and scripture service, with an invitation for each person to come forward to receive a cross of ashes placed on your forehead. Ashes area traditional Christian symbol for mortality and repentance. Mortality, because even though our spirit lives eternally, our bodies eventually die and return to the dust of the ground, and repentance because long ago, when people felt remorse for something they did or did not do, they would put ashes on their head and wear scratchy clothing as a reminder of the discomfort sin brings to our life. The ashes come from burnt palm leaves from past Palm Sundays. The ashes are then mixed with a small amount of oil and saved for future Ash services.
