

Leading up to Easter . . . The final week of Jesus' life on earth is well documented in scripture. Beginning with Palm Sunday, and concluding with Good, or Dark, Friday, we read of a volatile, heart-felt, emotional, and certainly spiritual range of events. Palm Sunday is celebration. The Palms we wave are reminiscent of Jesus riding into the city of Jerusalem for the final time, on a donkey, and with onlookers spreading palm branches in the road as symbols of victory. But, the mood quickly drew dark as Jesus entered the temple and chased off the money changers (people exchanging currency from other nations for a commission), and those who extorted money from the worshiping congregation's tithe. As opposition to Jesus' ministry heightened, and plots were devised to charge and end His life, there also were touching moments of faith and discipleship that moved the heart of God.

We read of the Last Supper on Thursday of that week. This was a time of fellowship and instruction to the disciples of what was to come. And we read of intense prayer as Jesus knelt in the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. As sweat and trembling enveloped him, he prayer for strength to follow through to the death as a sacrifice for humankind. We read of the silence of Saturday, and of the Resurrection on early Sunday morning. First Baptist remembers the final week of Jesus' life with the following schedule.

How is the Date for Easter Determined?

The date of Easter is actually based on the Gregorian calendar in cooperation with the lunar calendar. In other words, the cycle of the moon determines the date of Easter. It flows like this: The first Sunday following the first full moon, following March 21 (vernal equinox **or** first day of spring). So, Easter happens after March 21, but not until the first full moon after March 21. This year, the first full moon after March 21 is on Saturday, April 4. And, the first Sunday after this is . . . April 5!! Easter will always fall during a span from March 23 to April 23.


